The objective of Streator Township High School is that all students will reach their potential while preparing to become independent, productive, and responsible members of society. Streator Township High School strives to offer a challenging academic curriculum, a solid technological foundation, and a comprehensive extracurricular program in a safe and effective learning environment.

COMMUNITY:

Streator Township High School District #40 is a comprehensive high school with programs for students of all ability levels and career interests. Streator is 90 miles southwest of Chicago in north central Illinois, in a community of approximately 15,000 people.

PROFILE OF STREATOR HIGH SCHOOL:

Streator High School graduated its first class in 1876. SHS is a high school with grades 9-12 and is accredited by North Central Association and has full recognition status by the Illinois State Board of Education. Enrollment (2022-2023) = 816.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS:

A unit of credit is given for the satisfactory completion of a regular course taken five times each week during the school year. One-half (0.5) may be earned each semester for each course successfully completed.

*English – 4 credits

*Mathematics – 3 credits

*Science – 3 credits

*US History – 1 credit

*Civics – ½ (.5) credit & ½ (.5) elective Social Studies– one credit. All students must complete four semesters of social studies.

*Consumer Education – ½ (.5) credit

* Career Technology- ½ (.5) credit

*PE/Health/Dr. Education – 4 credits

*Passing the proficiency test on the state and national constitutions, the Declaration of Independence and the display of our national flag, usually taken in Civics.

*Art, Music, Foreign Language, or Vocational Education – 1 credit

Underclass students are to take **18.0** units of credit of required classes and **7.5** other elective units of credit approved by the administration. The total units of credit for graduation must equal **25.5**

SCHOOL YEAR:

The school year is divided into two semesters and each semester into two nine-week quarters. Classes are conducted in a block schedule with 4 classes on “A” day and 4 classes on “B” day. Each class is 85 minutes long. First semester is 18 weeks long, with 1st quarter and 2nd quarter. Second semester is also 18 weeks long, with 3rd quarter and 4th quarter. The entire school year is 36 weeks long.

GRADES:

Grades are given by letter with plus and minus used on the quarterly reports and the permanent records. A+, A, and A- represent excellent work; B+, B, and B- above average; C+, C, C- average work; D+, D and D- below average, but passing, F - failure, IC represents an incomplete grade, P represents either a Medical excuse from physical education or the pass grade for seniors who may be exempt from a final exam. Arrangements for the work to be made up must be made within two days after the student was absent. The instructor and the student should then designate a specific time and day, agreed upon by both, to have the said work, whether it be homework, quiz, or test, be completed.

The school has adopted the following method of calculating semester grades.

40% (1st 9 weeks) 40% (2nd 9 weeks) 20% (Final Exams)

All courses, including Physical Education, count towards the class rank and GPA.

Weighted classes include: AP U.S. History, AP Government, Western Civilizations, Pre-Calculus-A, Calculus-A, General Elementary Statistics, College Algebra, College General Biology, AP Physics, English IV-A, German IV, Spanish IV and AP Music Theory.

Illinois Valley Community College dual credit courses offered include Sociology, Western Civilization, Pre-Calculus-A, Calculus-A, General Elementary Stats, College Algebra, College General Biology, English IV-A, Speech and Strategies for College.

SPECIAL EDUCATION:

Courses are offered for Mentally Impaired, Learning Disabled, other Health Impaired and Behavior Disabled students. Services are available for physically, visually and hearing impaired students along with speech and language services.
